

MIXED 4-3-2-1

Players should arrive no later than 15 minutes before game time to set up equipment and allow the convenor sufficient time to prepare the score cards and set up the rinks.

In the game of 4-3-2-1 you play as an individual, not as a team.

Score Card:

- You will be provided with a score card indicating a rink number (where you play) and a sequence number (the order in which you will play the first end).
- Enter in your name on the card and return it to the convenor at the end of the game.

How the game is played:

The object of the game is to be closest to the jack after each end.

- Three 4 end games will be played.
- Three or four players are assigned to each rink (depending on the numbers).
- Each player rolls four bowls in sequence as per the order on the score cards.
- In subsequent ends, the bowler who scores the closest bowl will begin the next end.
- At the end of the first and second game, the player who scores the most points will move to the rink on their left. The incoming player will bowl first.

General Rules:

1. The leading edge of the mat must be placed 2 metres from the ditch.
2. If you knock the jack out of bounds, you score zero and the each of the other players score 3 points.
3. Players in second or third position rake the bowls.
4. Player in 4th position sets the jack.

How to score:

1. At the completion of each end, enter in your points on the score pad.
2. The player closest to the jack scores 4 points, second closest 3 points, third closest 2 points and fourth 1 point.
3. At the completion of The game, calculate your total points. The person with the most points moves.
4. The total number of points for each player should total 40 points. By checking this total, scoring and/or addition errors can be found and corrected.
5. Follow the same steps for Games 2 and 3.
6. At the end of three games tally up your total score, mark it on the score pad and return it to the convenor.

Note: * For three players, closest to the jack scores 4 points, second 3 points and third 1 point. There is no 2 point award.
